Notes for HEINRICH "HENRY" DIEVENDORF: Henry, who immigrated about 1725, is the earliest ancestor of this family in America (source: Reynolds, 1911). He settled in Montgomery Co, NY at the present site of Currytown, near Canajoharie. Family tradition has it that he was a brother of Johannes, but I am not aware of any solid proof of this relationship. Bell (1932) also points to tradition as the source of information about their relationship as brothers. He stated that all the Devendorf descendants traced in his book go back to the brothers Henry and Johannes Devendorf (p. 47). Bell stated that there was virtually no record of Henry Devendorf, "other than tradition" (p. 47), but family tradition and the statements of local historians strengthen the tradition that he existed.

Notes for JOHANNES DIEVENDORF: Johannes appears to have settled just outside the Mohawk Valley about two miles from the current town of Ft. Plain, in Minden, NY. In his will, John left everything to his son John Jacob. The will was filed on November 12, 1791 in Montgomery Co, NY.

Notes for CATHERINE DIEVENDORF: This may be the Catherine who married Johannes Windecker, who was in Klock's company in 1763. His will was dated 25 jun 1791 and probated 10 Nov 1794 (Montgomery Co. Will Book I). They were married in Stone Arabia Reformed Church 29 Oct 1765. Her will was dated 5 May 1810 and probated 3 Jan 1811 (Herkimer Co. Will Book B).

Notes for JOHANNES WINDECKER: John was in Klock's Company in 1763. His will was written on June 25, 1791 and probated on November 10, 1794 (source: Jones, Henry Z., The Palatine Families of New York: A Study of the German Immigrants Who Arrived in Colonial New York in 1710, Universal City, CA, 1985, p. 1101).

**4. CAPTAIN HENRY<sup>4</sup> DIEVENDORF** (*HEINRICH "HENRY"<sup>3</sup>, LUDWIG<sup>2</sup> DUBENDORFER, JACOB<sup>1</sup>*) was born Abt. 1735, and died August 06, 1777 in NY. He married ANNA ROSINA. She was born Abt. 1740, and died January 24, 1847 in NY.

Notes for CAPTAIN HENRY DIEVENDORF: Henry fought in the Fifth Company of Colonel Herkimer's Canajoharie Regiment, Tryon County Militia. "While in command of his Company at Oriskany he was mortally wounded by a bullet through his lungs, and died almost as he fell on the battlefield. His name appears on the Oriskany Battlefield Monument with two other Dievendorfs - Johann and John, both of whom were privates." Henry's will was written on March 24, 1772 and probated on August 20, 1783 (Albany Co, NY Wills and Deeds 498-D89).

**5. LIEUT. CAPT. JACOB D.<sup>4</sup> DIEVENDORF** (*HEINRICH "HENRY"<sup>3</sup>, LUDWIG<sup>2</sup> DUBENDORFER, JACOB<sup>1</sup>*) was born July 24, 1740 in Currytown, NY<sup>7</sup>, and died November 23, 1816 in Currytown, Montgomery Co, NY<sup>8</sup>. He married ELISABETH BELLINGER December 16, 1762 in NY prob. Montgomery Co., daughter of PHILIP BELLINGER and ELISABETHA BAUMAN. She was born April 22, 1742 in NY<sup>9</sup>, and died December 29, 1804 in Montgomery Co, NY<sup>10</sup>.

Notes for LIEUT. CAPT. JACOB D. DIEVENDORF: Captain in the Revolutionary War. Jacob was a farmer who owned considerable property in the town of Root, where he and his father were early settlers. He is called the first white settler of Root, actually settling in Currytown prior to the Revolutionary War. Jacob's will was dated 28 Feb 1816 and probated 1 Feb 1917 (sources: Bell, 1932; Montgomery Co, NY, Calendar of Wills). His residence was listed as Charleston. The will is excellent documentation of his living family. I found it interesting that Jacob willed "my seat No. five on the Gallery in the white church in Curry Town" to Jacob Stowits, son of his daughter Margaret and George Stowits. He left his pew No. 4 on the lower floor to his 3 grandsons and he left seat No. 5 on the lower floor to his six granddaughters. Jacob's wife was not mentioned in the will, providing evidence of her earlier death. The cemetery where Jacob and Elizabeth are buried is Dievendorf Burial Lot, Root, Montgomery Co, NY, "located in a

pasture about 400 feet southeast of the Hubschmitt home, which is on the Sloansville Road. The cemetery is surrounded by a metal fence, still in good condition, and contains three monuments, visible from the road. The cemetery is grown up with trees and brush, mostly poison ivy, making the location of the stones difficult. Many of the stones are lying on the ground, partially buried. The owner of the land mentioned some unmarked fieldstones which I failed to locate. I cannot be positive that I located every tombstone" (Elswick, Albert, Copied 1 Aug 1967).

Montgomery Co.. He married CATHERINE HESS April 19, 1768 in NY by Rev. Mr. Rosencrantz. She was born July 27, 1746<sup>18</sup>, and died December 15, 1838 in NY prob. Montgomery Co..

Notes for JOHANNES DIEVENDORF: John's pension application gives the birth dates of John and Catherine, and gives their marriage date. It also details his service during the Revolutionary War beginning in Feb. 1776, when he entered the company commanded by Capt. Henry Diefendorff, Sergeant Jacob Diefendorff and Ensign George Countryman in Col. Ebenezer Cox's Regiment. He was called into service several times during the next three years and was stationed at Fort Plain several times. His last service was in May 1787 when he was at Fort Plain for 3 months. At the age of 90, he gave his testimony on 27 Sept. 1832 before Henry I. Diefendorff Esquire, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas. At that time, he resided in Minden, NY. Several transcriptions of Revolutionary War pensions were found at the web site titled "Morrison's Pensions." In 1837 John's wife, Catherine, applied for a pension as a widow.

Notes for ESQUIRE JOHN JACOB DIEVENDORF: John Jacob spent his life in the Schoharie and Mohawk Valleys, where he was known as "Esquire Diefendorff." "When the Revolutionary War broke out he joined Colonel Klock's Tryon County Regiment in April 1775. He survived the war and at its close became a pensioner." (Vrooman, 1951). A transcription of his pension application can be found at the website "Morrison's Pensions." He received a pension of \$64.88 per year. She married CHRISTIAN BELLINGER November 16, 1784 in Caughnawaga, NY<sup>29</sup>, son of PHILIP BELLINGER and ELIZABETH FINCK. He was born January 15, 1764 in Randall, Montgomery Co, NY<sup>30</sup>, and died May 02, 1838 in Newville, Montgomery Co, NY, buried in Bellinger Road Cemetery, Danube, Herkimer Co, NY<sup>31</sup>.

Notes for CHRISTIAN BELLINGER: I have also seen his name as Johann Christian. He was baptized on January 31, 1764 at the German Flats Reformed Church, Stone Arabia, NY. In 1780, he enlisted in Tryon Co. Militia, 5th Regiment, Revolutionary War (source: Family Sketches of Danube Twp, Herkimer County, NY, [www.rootsweb.com/nyherkim/danube/danubefam.html](http://www.rootsweb.com/nyherkim/danube/danubefam.html)). He was captured by Indians and taken to [Niagara] Canada at the destruction of Currytown in Oct. 1781. He was released 21 May 1783. Christian purchased a farm from Jelles Fonda and settled in the eastern part of Danube, NY in 1792 (source: Walter, William Irving, A sketch of Some of the Prominent Families of the Town of Danube, Address delivered before the Herkimer County Historical Society, 11 April 1903). Due to service during the Revolutionary War, he drew a small pension until his death. He was at one time the owner of 4 slaves (source: Danube Twp Family Sketches). Christian and Barbara are buried in Montgomery Co, NY cemetery on Bellinger Rd. in St. Johnsville Twp.

"Christian Bellinger was born in 1764 and came to Danube in 1792. He was a son of Frederick Bellinger and with his younger brother, Andrew, was captured by the Indians and taken to Canada at the destruction of Currytown in 1781. On his return he married Barbara, daughter of Jacob Diefendorf, a leading resident of that locality. He died in 1838. His son, Philip C. Bellinger, lived on the farm until his death in February, 1872, and it is now in the possession of his only surviving son, Washington. Philip C. Bellinger was a prominent figure in town for many years and he left an enviable reputation as a man of strict business integrity. His wife was a member of the Zimmerman family and their descendants in Danube and Minden are quite numerous. Jacob, a brother of Philip, died in the town of Little Falls in 1859 where his descendants still reside. Of the daughters of Christian Bellinger, one married Conrad Snell of Danube, one Abraham Snell of Minden, and one Conrad Mowers of Stark" (source: Walter, 1903).

Catherine received \$1200 in her father's will.

Notes for CONRAD MOWERS: His father-in-law, Jacob Diefendorf, left a will written in 1816 (source: Bell, O.W., 1932). His daughter Catherine, was listed as the widow of Conrad Mowers, but this is thought to mean they were divorced. Three children were listed as heirs of Jacob Diefendorf: Jacob, Nancy, and Elizabeth Mowers.

This Conrad is probably the man who received a Pension dated 1832 from Montgomery Co, NY for service during the Revolutionary War. According to Robert Matteson (Town Historian for Smyrna, NY in 2006) that Conrad was married three times. His 3rd wife, Barbara, is buried in the North Side Cemetery, Plymouth, NY. The Conrad who lived in Smyrna, NY was listed on the 1840 census as a Pensioner, age 79, making him born about 1761.

Several of the citizens were killed or captured and taken to Canada during the Indian and Tory raid on Currytown, NY on 9 July 1781, known as "Invasion Day." Jacob was taken south to Sharon, and the Indians

began killing prisoners. He was scalped by Indians and left for dead. He was found the next day by Col. Vedder and taken to Stone Arabia, where he remained for five years. Later in life, he became very wealthy in land, but he always suffered pain and discomfort from his scalp wound. Excerpt from The History of Montgomery County: The Town of Root: The author tells a story about the Indian attack called "oxtader's murderous raid up the settlement in 1781" when Jacob Dievendorf was scalped. "Mr. Lossing thus speaks in his Pictorial Field Book of the Revolution, published in 1851: We reached Currytown, a small village nearly four miles south of Canajoharie, at about noon. The principal object of my visit there was to see the venerable Jacob Dievendorff, who with his family was among the sufferers when that settlement was destroyed by Indians and Tories in July 1781. Accompanied by his son-in-law (Dr. Snow, of Currytown) we found the old patriot busily engaged in his barn threshing grain; and although nearly eighty years of age he seemed almost as vigorous and active as most men are at sixty. His sight and hearing are somewhat defective, but his intellect, as exhibited by his clear remembrance of the circumstances of his early life, had lost but little of its strength. He is one of the largest landowners in Montgomery county, owning one thousand fertile acres lying in a single tract, where the scenes of his sufferings in early life occurred. In an orchard a short distance from his dwelling the house was still standing which was stockaded and used as a fort. It is fast decaying, but the venerable owner allows time alone to work its destruction, and will not suffer a board to be taken from it. The venerable man here spoken of died Oct. 8, 1854, at the age of 84, the most wealthy resident of the town. His remains lie in the family burial place with those of his parents, on the homestead farm, which he bequeathed to his grandson, Jacob Dievendorff" (p. 163).

as a soldier in the War of 1812 (source: Hollice and Debbie, Index of Awards, Claims of the Soldiers of the War of 1812, [www.usgennet.org/usa/ny/state/1812/l-p/moulter-muscoott.html](http://www.usgennet.org/usa/ny/state/1812/l-p/moulter-muscoott.html)). When Conrad received his War of 1812 claim he lived in Stark, Herkimer Co, NY. On Shane Mowers' database, the birthdate of Conrad is shown as about 24 June 1791. However, the 1850 census shows an earlier birthdate, and the 1860 census shows a birthdate of about 1781.

1830 census: Stark, Herkimer Co, NY: Conrad Mours lived next door to his brother, John G. Mours.

Christian Bellinger was born in 1764 and came to Danube in 1792. He was a son of Frederick Bellinger and with his younger brother, Andrew, was captured by the Indians and taken to Canada at the destruction of Currytown in 1781. On his return he married Barbara, daughter of Jacob Diefendorf, a leading resident of that locality. He died in 1838. His son, Philip C. Bellinger, lived on the farm until his death in February, 1872, and it is now in the possession of his only surviving son, Washington. Philip C. Bellinger was a prominent figure in town for many years and he left an enviable reputation as a man of strict business integrity. His wife was a member of the Zimmerman family and their descendants in Danube and Minden are quite numerous. Jacob, a brother of Philip, died in the town of Little Falls in 1859 where his descendants still reside. Of the daughters of Christian Bellinger, one married Conrad Snell of Danube, one Abraham Snell of Minden, and one Conrad Mowers of Stark. Missing in action Dec 31/62. "Captured at the battle of Murfreesboro, Tenn., Dec 31/64; paroled at City Point, Va., Jany 26/63; reported at Camp Parole, Md., date not stated and was sent to Benton Bks, Mo., March 11, 1863, where he appears on muster roll as present in March and sick in Hospital April 1863 - date he rejoined company not stated" (source: Illinois GenWeb Civil War Veterans).

Roll of Company for May and June/63 reports him s---- Gen. Hosp. St. Louis, Mo., from Benton Bks June 6/63. His name is on a stone slab at the park at Pea Ridge, Ark., he was at this battle field during the war. The battle of Pea Ridge was fought March 7-8, 1862; it decided the fate of Missouri for the Union. Subsequently, to April 30/64, reported present. Wounded in the face in action at Nose Creek (Kenesaw Mountain) Ga., June 20-28, 1864-exact date cannot be stated" Mustered out with Company Sept 27, 1864.
